## CITY BAR VISITOR VACCINATION POLICY Effective September 7, 2021

Beginning September 7, 2021 all visitors who are at least 12 years old must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 to enter the building.

"Visitor" means anyone who is not an employee, intern or volunteer and includes City Bar members, clients, guests, contractors and members of the public. "Fully vaccinated" means at least 14 days from an individual's final dose of a COVID-19 vaccine authorized for emergency use by the United States Food and Drug Administration or by the World Health Organization, or any active COVID-19 vaccine used during a U.S.-based clinical trial (click <u>here</u> for the current list of acceptable vaccines). As children under 12 are not yet eligible for vaccination, they must wear a mask and be accompanied by a vaccinated adult.

Vaccination is not required for individuals making deliveries or pickups, for individuals who enter the building solely for the purpose of making necessary repairs, or for individuals picking up items. However, these individuals must wear a face mask and maintain six feet of social distance from other people.

Visitors must display one of the following forms of proof, as well as matching personal identification, to designated City Bar personnel immediately upon entering the building:

- NYC COVID Safe App: <u>Android</u> | <u>iOS</u>
- Excelsior Pass
- CDC Vaccination Card (or photo)
- <u>NYC Vaccination Record</u>
- An official immunization record from outside NYC or the U.S.

"Personal identification" means an official document bearing the name of the individual and a photo or date of birth. Examples of acceptable identification include but are not limited to: driver's license, non-driver government ID card, IDNYC, passport, and school ID card.

If a visitor received the vaccine outside the U.S., they must produce an official immunization record that includes: (1) first name and last name; (2) date of birth (3) vaccine product name (only vaccines authorized by the WHO are acceptable); (4) date(s) administered; (5) site where the vaccine was administered, or name of the person who administered it.

Visitor requests for reasonable accommodations should be directed to Customer Relations and will be considered on a case-by-case basis. As per <u>City guidance</u>, the City Bar is not permitted to allow unvaccinated visitors to enter its premises for anything beyond a quick and limited purpose (such as picking up or dropping off a package), even as an accommodation. However, we will endeavor to serve visitors outside, by phone, or through an online platform rather than inside our building.
